President's Letter – Patrick and Eileen Krause

CRDA's Board of Directors is proposing two by-law changes. These proposed changes will be voted on by the membership at the general membership meeting which will be on Saturday, November 6th at the Gala. Since the Round of the Month program has no participation, the first by-law proposal is to reflect that no Round of the Month is being chosen. The Board of Directors decided to use Round-a-lab's Rounds of the Quarter. The second proposed by-law change is for the opportunity for a director to serve a second 3-year term. The current by-law says that a director can serve one 3-year term, and must go off the board for 1-year before going back on the board. The proposed by-law change says that a director "may" serve a second 3-year term, and then go off the board for 1-year before going back on the board. The director is not elected or required to serve 2 terms. As many of you know, Round dancing is not getting many new dancers. It has become increasingly hard to find dancers willing to be on the board, so this proposed change would allow for a director to stay on the board another term. There has been some opposition to this proposed by-law change because some people believe that new people need to be on the board so that it does not become stagnate. Please read these proposed by-law changes in this Round Notes and they will be posted on CRDA's website.

CRDA Bylaw Change Proposals

Item #1 (increase Board of Director allowed length of service):

Article IV. Section 3. Election of the Board of Directors. Paragraph A.

Currently reads:

All candidates for the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of CRDA. Annually three (3) Directors shall be elected for terms of three (3) years. Directors shall not serve consecutive terms. At least one year shall elapse between terms.

Draft proposal:

All candidates for the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of CRDA. Annually three (3) Directors shall be elected for terms of three (3) years. ~~Directors shall not serve consecutive terms.~~ Directors may serve up to two consecutive terms. At least one year shall elapse before candidates are eligible for re-election.

Item #3 (remove Round of Month references):

Article II – Purposes

Currently reads:

The purposes of CRDA shall be: to encourage, foster and promote Round Dancing in Colorado, the United States and the World; to provide for the free exchange of dance related material, other useful and helpful information, and ideas among members and other interested parties; to offer training, advice, and encouragement to members and other interested parties; to engage in other activities such as selection of Rounds of the Month, organization of various Round Dance events, and dissemination of information related to dance offerings.

Draft Proposal:

The purposes of CRDA shall be: to encourage, foster and promote Round Dancing in Colorado, the United States and the World; to provide for the free exchange of dance related material, other useful and helpful information, and ideas among members and other interested parties; to offer training, advice, and encouragement to members and other interested parties; to engage in other activities ~~such as selection of Rounds of the Month~~ including encouraging use of Rounds of the Quarter from national associations, organization of various Round Dance events, and dissemination of information related to dance offerings.

Article VIII. Standing Committees. Section 1.E.

Currently reads:

Membership of the Round of the Month Committee shall include any member of CRDA who is currently, or has been active in teaching and/or cuing ROUNDALAB Phase III (easy-intermediate) level or higher rounds. The President shall appoint, to the degree possible, a non-teacher member, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, to serve as Moderator of this committee. If a non-teacher member cannot be found to serve as moderator, a teacher member may be appointed and approved, but they shall not vote on committee issues.

Draft Proposal:

The Moderator shall furnish the Newsletter Editor a report of each meeting.

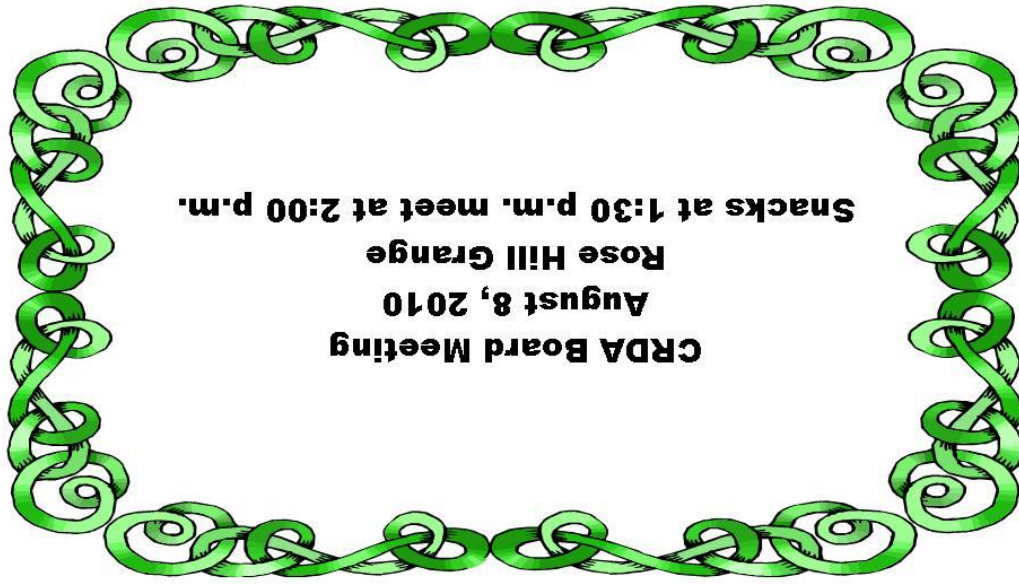
